R&E network connectivity for US campuses abroad

- Case of US institutions helping to instigate NREN capabilities
 - Example: Qatar
 - Texas A&M, Cornell, Carnegie Mellon, VCU, Georgetown – worked with Qatar Foundation to get connectivity for all institutions to global R&E network infrastructure

R&E network connectivity for US campuses abroad

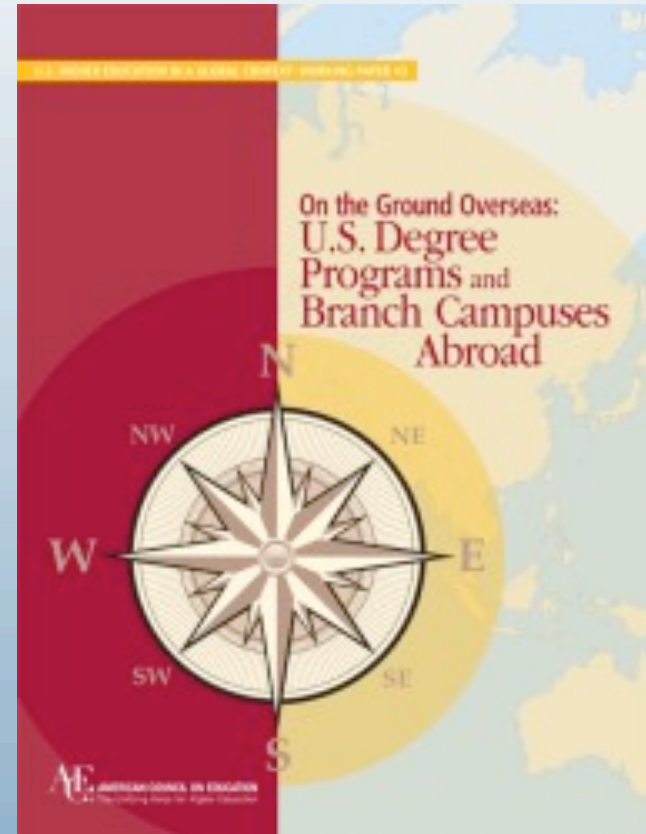
- Countries with emerging NRENs
 - Example: United Arab Emirates
 - UAE universities under leadership of Khalifa University of Science and Technology began effort to interconnect/build NREN 2+ years ago
 - Not yet connecting universities beyond government-funded universities

Beyond just R&E network connectivity

- Commercial Internet connectivity
- Data backup/storage/disaster recovery solutions
- Other telecommunications capabilities
- IT-related policy considerations
 - Data policies
 - Compliance with local regulations
- IT support needs
